SEXWORK - as safe as possible

When you offer sex services, YOU decide where you work, how often you work, how long you work and what you offer.

The following tips can help you with your work:

- Working legally means that no one can easily blackmail you
- Do not let anyone persuade you to do something that you do not want to do
- It's good to have a fixed price list with reasonable prices
- Pay attention to your colleagues, it gives you a good sense of security and better cooperation
- Always keep your documents with you
- Make sure your cell phone is easily accessible and always charged
- Do not leave your money and valuables (mobile phones, ID cards, bags) or other personal belongings lying around openly in the common area or in your room
- Do not sign anything you do not understand
- A tenancy agreement regulates the rights and obligations of both parties and both parties must adhere to the agreements. If a rent is agreed for a room, this amount should also include all additional services such as laundry and toiletries.

Respectful interaction with one another is essential.

• Do not talk to dissatisfied customers alone, rather call in a colleague for a joint discussion

- Listen to your instincts! Do not take a customer that you do not feel comfortable with
- Do not take your eyes off the customer, especially their hands
- Avoid positions that are unfavourable to you: e.g. performing oral sex between your customer's knees
- Be careful with drunk, aggressive or distraught customers
- Protect yourself from infection through safer sex
- Do not let anyone persuade you to have sex without a condom
- Take a close look at the customer and pay attention to hygiene (e.g. when showering together)
- If you suspect an infection with a sexually transmitted disease, have yourself and your partner examined by a doctor straight away
- If you offer escort services, tell somebody (e.g. colleagues) where you are going (address)
- If the client does not want to honour the negotiated conditions, cancel the meeting and leave the location

If a customer forces you to do something you have not agreed to and/or you do not want to do, say NO clearly.

If the customer does not stop, it is rape and you should report it to the police. The counsellors can help you with that.
